


2019 MLHS Math Bowl

Dear Principals,

Your students are invited to participate in Manitowoc Lutheran High School's Elementary Math Bowl. This year's math bowl will be held in conjunction with our Academic Fair on Saturday, April 6th. The math bowl will consist of an individual session from 10:45-11:30 AM, and a team tournament from 11:30AM-12:30PM. The individual session will include 4 timed tests of 10 minutes each. These contests will make up a student's individual score. These scores will also contribute to the team's total score. After the individual contests are completed, the team scores will be calculated, and the top 8 teams will advance to the Team Math Bowl Tournament. Those 8 teams will be seeded according to their team score, and will play a head-to-head single-elimination bracket tournament. Each Team Math Bowl Tournament round will be a mix of turn-based and toss-up questions pitting one team against another. At the end of each Team Math Bowl Tournament round, the winning teams will advance until a winner is crowned champion. Points scored in the Team Math Bowl Tournament will not count towards an individual's score. **Calculators will not be allowed for any portion of the Math Bowl.** Spectators will only be allowed during the Team Math Bowl Tournament.



A team will consist of five members, **with at most 3** eighth graders. Each school may enter as many of these 5 member teams as they would like. Each school entering a team is asked to have a teacher or advisor present on the day of the meet. They will monitor or help score the contests.

Awards will be given to the individuals in grades five, six, seven, and eight with the highest 3 scores from the individual contests. We will award the top two teams in the Math Bowl Tournament individual ribbons and a team plaque to be kept at each school.

The registration form will be sent via email and is due by March 15th.
